

School Funds Recovered In State Antitrust Suit

The Torrance school district has received \$2,374 as its share of some \$610,000 which the state received in settlement of antitrust action against manufacturers of metal library shelving.

The antitrust suit was filed more than a year ago by Attorney General Thomas Lynch in a federal district court in Chicago. Named in the action

were seven firms who produce about 95 per cent of all metal library shelving in the United States.

The firms were charged with engaging in a conspiracy and combination to divide the market, allocate customers, and to refrain from price competition with each other.

Named were the Sperry Rand Corp. of New York, N.Y., Art Metal Inc., of Jamestown,

N.Y., Globe-Werneke Industries, Inc., of Toledo, Ohio, W. R. Ames Co. of Milpitas, Calif., Estey Corp. of Red Bank, N.J., Hamilton Manufacturing Co. of Two Rivers, Wis., and Gray Manufacturing Co., Inc., of Tecumseh, Mich.
