

### Suspect Arrested In Chase

Torrance police arrested an 18-year-old youth on suspicion of grand theft auto and evading arrest early Sunday after the youth reportedly crashed a car into a fence.

Timothy W. Owens, of 2450 W. Pacific Coast Hwy., was arrested at 18409 Falda Ave. about 2 a.m., police said.

Police said they pursued a car through an alley to 190th Street after they received a report a car was being stolen in front of 3134 W. 188th St. They chased the car west on 190th St. and north on Glenburn Avenue to 185th Street, officers said.

The car went out of control at 185th Street and Glenburn Avenue and hit a wooden fence, officers said. The driver fled and a search of the area turned up Owens, police said.

### Germans Plan Visit, Game At El Camino

### Garden Checklist

1. Blue hydrangeas will benefit from an application of iron or aluminum sulphate — either will intensify the blue color of the blooms.
2. Shasta Daisies should be divided every second or third year to maintain their vigor. Replant only the healthiest divisions.
3. While bare root roses may be available for planting for about another two weeks, don't wait to plant them. Right now is the best time.
4. Plant dwarf fruit trees now. The tree is small but produces standard sized fruit.
5. Plant gladiolus now and plan to make successive planting each month until June for a long display of gladiolus bloom.
