

Brazilian Group Launches Rotary Exchange Program

Six young business and professional men from Brazil, accompanied by a Brazilian Rotarian, are spending some two months in the Los Angeles area under the Group Study Exchange Program of Rotary International.

Involved are the clubs in District 457 in Brazil and District 528, embracing 32 clubs in the Los Angeles area including all Rotary clubs in the South Bay.

The visitors arrived last week to begin a carefully planned itinerary which will keep them busy until April 8.

THE BUSY program is the result of months of work by a committee headed by Erny Ellis, a member of the Torrance Rotary Club and governor-elect for District 528.

Members of his committee are Scott Miller of Westchester, Jack Spencer of Redondo Beach, and Kenneth N. Garcelon of Torrance.

The committee has worked closely with Dr. Tom Sechrist, district governor, and members of his staff.

Rotarian leader of the group from Brazil will be Christopher A. Burrows, who holds an insurance classification in the Rotary club of Petropolis, Brazil.

South Bay Rotary clubs will be involved in visitors' inspection of such places as Los Angeles International Airport and Los Angeles Harbor, Magnavox Laboratories, El Camino College, Redondo Beach King Harbor, Marineland, and the Standard Oil Refinery.
