Cannibalism, head-hunting, and other primitive ceremonies of New Guinea will be highlighted in a film lecture by explorer Lewis Catlow, Monday at 8 p.m. in the El Camino College Campus Theater.

The last in a four-part series, "The World Around Us," sponsored by the Associated Students of El Camino, the program is devoted to the stone age of New Guinea.

Catlow, an explorer and anthropologist, has traveled in more than 100 countries and has made 12 major expeditions. He has delved into the mysteries of New Guinea, Africa, the Amazon, and the higher Arctic to film and study the most backward and dramatic people of remote areas.

The author of several books on his adventures, Catlow makes a limited number of personal appearances a year. Tickets are \$1 and are available in the college bookstore.
