DECISION OF THE City Council to add a pay proposal on the ballot at the consolidated city-school election next month evoked immediate cries from school officials and from others concerned with the city's library bond issue. "It's like stopping for a pretty hitchhiker only to have a thug climb in the car with her," the Press-Herald was told.

NONE OF the school people—including members of the board—wanted to get into a public debate with councilmen on the matter, but several of them had plenty to say "off the record."

"The action poses a definite threat to the city's bond issue for library facilities," one person said. Most expressed resentment that the partisan issue had been injected into the consolidated election.
