Dorothy Digs

During the winter season the soil sometimes becomes hardened and the weeds have started to grow. You can discourage this growth by applying a contact weed killer that is non-selective and will not sterilize your soil. This will permit you to plant your garden on schedule without the work of continuous weeding.

A spray with a petroleum base emulsion that can be mixed with water is best and also makes it very economical to use. Remember that weeds also harbor insects and fungus that will spread to the garden.

I always put some steer manure or peat moss into the soil to loosen it up and if you have alkaline soil in your area sprinkle a little soluble iron to stimulate green growth.

You may find signs of a few snails and slugs appearing in your ivy and ground cover now.

Ask your nursery for the snail or slug killer without arsenic in it as it is much safer around pets and children and is very effective.
