To Head Campaign

Woolley Selects Chairman

Appointment of Dr. Rodney A. Stetson, a Torrance physician and civic leader, as campaign chairman was announced today by Boris Woolley, Republican candidate in the special 46th Assembly District election.

Dr. Stetson, a graduate of St. Mary's College and former chief of staff at Torrance Memorial Hospital, has lived in this city since 1946. He now lives at 1427 El Prado.

In accepting the appointment, Dr. Stetson said he regarded his job as a key one in the Woolley campaign since Torrance represents about one-third of the population of the Assembly district.

Primary balloting is scheduled April 11 in the special election. A run-off will be held May 9 if one is necessary.

Equipment Ordered by Pipe Firm

An order for a steel pipe producing plant to be built in England has been received by Torrance Machinery and Engineering, Inc., a subsidiary of P & F Industries, Inc.

The order brings to some \$20 million the backlog which is on order from the local firm, C. A. Babbitt, president, said.

The new contract calls for a 6-to-20-inch capacity steel pipe plant to be put into operation in early 1968. The plant will have a capacity of 300,000 tons of steel pipe.

Pipe producing equipment previously has been ordered from the Torrance-based company by firms in Australia, Japan, and Iran, Babbitt said.

Arraignment Ordered in Robbery Case

A Torrance man arrested on suspicion of attempted robbery of a North Torrance liquor store on March 10 has been ordered to appear in Superior Court to answer the charge.

William Spencer Hamric, 23, no address listed, was ordered yesterday to appear April 3 in Department A of the Southwest Superior Court. He is to be arraigned on the charge at that time.

Hamric was remanded to the county jail in lieu of \$1,100 bail following the preliminary hearing Monday in South Bay Municipal Court.
