She Becomes First Woman In The Post

Mrs. Louis Kaplan this week became the first woman president of the Riviera Homeowners when she was installed to succeed Stanley Dunn in the organization's top post.

Mrs. Kaplan, whose husband is director of special services for the Torrance School district, and other members of her administration took over the offices at the organization's March board meeting held Monday evening at the Plush Horse.

The Riviera Homeowners, one of the oldest continuing groups of its type in the city, has a membership of 500 homeowners. Dunn said as he reviewed the past year for the board members and special guests.


