

# State Welfare Lid Wanted By County

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn have to come directly from County taxpayers and that would mean a jump of more than 14 cents on the tax rate," Hahn pointed out.

He stressed that the more realistic way to cut the welfare rolls is to encourage more work-training programs to prepare recipients for employment.

(A highly successful Community Work and Training Program operated in Los Angeles County for the past several years has resulted in placing thousands of recipients in jobs and saving taxpayers more than \$1 million monthly. This program was sparked by Supervisor Hahn.)

EVEN SO, in the past eight years Los Angeles County welfare budgets have skyrocketed, mainly because of new State and Federal laws liberalizing charity programs," he noted.

During that period, the cost of welfare for every citizen in Los Angeles County has risen from \$6.36 to \$9.08—42.8 per cent.

Because of these high costs, Hahn pointed out the Board of Supervisors has gone firmly on record to not support or endorse any welfare legislation increasing County expenditures unless the State Legislature bears the additional cost of providing additional revenue to the County.

"At the same time, we will continue to press for expansion of the Community Work and Training Program because it saves—not costs—taxpayers money and results in making welfare recipients productive citizens," Hahn said.
