Summer Classes Approved

Summer classes in the Torrance schools will begin Monday, June 19, and conclude July 28 under schedules approved Monday evening by the Board of Education. The regular spring term is due to end Friday, June 16. Summer classes will be offered at the elementary and high school levels, as well as by the adult education division. The Columbia School for educationally handicapped children also will offer summer classes. Classes at the high school level will be offered in virtually every subject normally offered at the school if enrollment is sufficient to warrant employment of a teacher, the board was told. In addition, adult education classes will be offered in mathematics, business, foreign languages, English, science, arts, and vocational and industrial arts. The district also plans to offer classes in remedial reading and to maintain the home teaching program during the six-week summer session.

to revoke Wooldridge's promotion.

IN A SEPARATE action, Mrs. Yvonne Nicolai, the wife of retired Torrance police officer, filed a claim against the city charging that it has illegally dispersed funds to Sergeant Wooldridge. Mrs. Nicolai, in a claim dated April 4, said she would file a taxpayer's suit to recover the funds if the city has not taken action to recover the funds and rescind Wooldridge's promotion. Councilmen, by their action last night, reaffirmed their action of last year by giving that action the force of an ordinance. (It originally was approved by resolution, which does not become a part of the city code.)

KEY SECTIONS of the ordinance, adopted both as an urgency measure and as a regular ordinance, provide that any finding of a court that the blanketing-in of employees in the newly approved positions, will, in effect, not require that pay increases be refunded to the city. The reclassification of the 150 employees has been effective for more than a year. About 550,000 U.S. homes are hit by fire each year, and over 6,000 persons—33 per cent of them children—die in these fires, National Fire Protection Association records show.
