

Measles Immunization Drive Under Way Here

A countywide campaign to immunize more than 250,000 children in the 1-to-10 age bracket against the dangerous effects of measles has been launched by the Los Angeles County Health Department. The program will culminate June 1 through 5 when free measles immunizations will be provided at centers throughout the county, Dr. Gerald A. Heidebreder, county health officer, said.

"With today's safe and highly effective vaccine, it would be a crime for any parent to deprive his child of complete protection against measles, which can result in

death or other tragic after-effects, including mental retardation or deafness," Dr. Heidebreder said.

HE SAID approximately 280,000 children in Los Angeles County under the age of 10 have not been immunized nor had the 10-day "red" measles.

The total, he explained, represents a possible 70 cases of permanent mental retardation or 28 deaths from measles encephalitis or other complications.

DURING the immunization period, health centers and special mobil units will be open throughout the county's 23 health districts. Special hours for the free immunizations will be noon to 8:30 p.m. Thursday and Friday, June 1 and 2; 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, June 3; noon to 4 p.m. Sunday, June 4; and 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday, June 5.
