

Youth Orchestra To Be Organized

Formation of a new musical group, to be known as the South Bay Youth Chamber Strings, has been announced by Paula Gwinn. The new group is sponsored by the Lomita Recreation Department. First meeting of the group, open to all young people who had at least one year of private study or who are recommended by their teacher, will be held Saturday from 3:30 until 5:30 p.m.

Mrs. Gwinn said young people who play the violin, viola, cello, or string bass are invited to join the group.

The director, a graduate of the College of Wooster in Wooster, Ohio, played for 15 years in the first violin section of the Denver Symphony Orchestra. She has studied at

the Cleveland Institute of Music at the Tanglewood Berkshire Music Center.

Mrs. Gwinn has performed under the direction of such noted conductors as Leopold Stowkowski, Ingor Stravinsky, Ondre Kostelanetz, Mor-

ton Gould, Paul Whiteman, and Leonard Bernstein. She presently is concertmaster of the South Bay Civic Symphony Orchestra.

REGULAR rehearsals for the South Bay Youth Cham-

ber Strings will be held at the Lomita Recreation Center the last Saturday of each month. The rehearsal time will be 3:30 to 5:30 p.m.

The group will appear in concert for the first time in September, Mrs. Gwinn said.
