Mr. Norman's topic will be "Is Cuba Betrayed Again?" when he speaks at the Queen's Kitchen, 1332 Sartori in Torrance. This meeting will begin at 11:30 a.m. tomorrow, according to Mrs. Stanley B. Jones, president of the group.

Norman's experiences in

the Cuban resistance movement have received worldwide coverage in the press, and radio and television.

A recipient of the American Legion Citation for Meritorious Service for his "devoted, truthful, and dramatic fight against Communism," Norman and his family now live in Los Angeles.

Mr. Norman has an intimate knowledge of present day conditions in Cuba, the Communist activities under Castro's government and before Castro came to power, and how the current Cuban situation affects the United States.
