Assembly, Senator Clash As Budget Wins Approval

SACRAMENTO — The political "fun and games" associated with passage of Governor Ronald Reagan's first budget — expected to be pretty extensive on a party-line basis — were overshadowed somewhat by a little fracas among the members of the legislature.

The budget, which was hammered out by a conference committee into a true compromise bill between the two houses, was approved handily. The vote in the senate was 31-8 (there's one vacancy in the 40-member senate) and in the assembly by a vote of 64-15 (there was one excused absence in the lower house).

In both houses, Democrats held up their votes for several roll calls, to give the Republicans a chance to vote first. As the Democratic leadership put it, they didn't want their party members voting for Reagan's budget if some of the hard-rock Republicans were going to hang back and vote "no." Some Republicans traditionally have voted against all of the budgets of former Governor Edmund G. Brown.

THE REAL problem over approval of the budget, and one which may carry over for some time, came from elimination of the salaries for two positions in the budget. The conference committee report left out the support salary for Dr. Everett Calvert, deputy superintendent of public instruction, under Dr. Max Rafferty, and E. G. (Chip) Nielsen, assistant deputy controller.

State Controller Houston T. Flournoy was an assemblyman until his election to the controller spot last November and his friends in both parties in the lower house are many. There was some attempt to hold up passage of the budget, requiring the writing of a new conference committee report, to restore Nielsen's salary to the budget.

It was found later, however, that this could be accomplished by amending bills which already are well along in the legislative process and this was done.

THE CONFERENCE committee had three members from each house but the one member of the six generally given credit for cutting Nielsen's salary out of the budget was Senator Richard J. Dolwig, R-Atherton.

The assemblymen retaliated the next day. Dolwig had a bill before the house dealing with taxation of possessory interests, primarily of a technical nature. It was handled for Dolwig on the assembly floor by Assemblyman George N. Zenovich, D-Fresno, who is the Democratic floorleader.

The bill, after a short debate, went to a roll call but then the members realized whose bill it was. In a rare display, the legislators, one after another, stood up and asked to have their names removed from the roll call.

THE RESULT was that the final vote on the bill was 22-5, with more than 50 abstentions.

Zenovich no doubt will bring the bill up again and most of the assemblymen probably have nothing against it. But they wanted to show their protest of Dolwig's action.

As Assemblyman John P. Quimby, D-Rialto, said when he rose to ask his name be removed from the roll: "When the message gets over to the senator, I want to make sure he knows I was in on it."


