Jehovah's Witnesses Plan 40 Conventions

The religious organization of Jehovah's Witnesses has announced a total of 43 conventions to be held in the United States during 1967.

Leonard Olliff, 22516 Normandie Ave., presiding minister of the Torrance congregation, said today that the meetings are planned in the United States, Canada, and the British Isles.

Olliff said that hundreds of volunteers will engage in a search for rooming accommodations in the Orange County area. Convention officials expect 11,000 delegates for the Costa Mesa gathering scheduled for the Orange County Fairgrounds, August 17 to 20.

In Torrance, more than 120 representatives are making travel arrangements for the Costa Mesa event. Other conventions in California will be in Pomona, Stockton, San Jose and Fresno.

Three hundred thousand delegates are expected to attend the United States conventions.
