

Tennis Clinics Set at Redondo Beach Schools

Plans for a series of tennis clinics to be conducted in cooperation with the Jack Kramer Tennis Club have been announced by the Redondo Beach Recreation and Parks Department.

Scheduled at both Redondo Union and Aviation high schools, the program is open to residents and non-residents of Redondo Beach. Sessions will begin July 25 and conclude Aug. 13.

All persons enrolled in the

program will be invited to attend a series of five clinics to be conducted by Vic Braden, head tennis professional at the Jack Kramer Tennis Club. Other professional players expected to participate in the program include Richard (Pancho) Gonzales, Jack Kramer, George McCall, and members of the U.S. Davis Cup team.

A fee of \$3 for residents of Redondo Beach and \$4 for non-residents will be charged.

General Telephone Offers Recreation, Job Program

Youngsters throughout the South Bay area will receive help in finding jobs and summer recreation from General Telephone Co. information operators as a part of a nationwide "summer youth" program sponsored by the General Telephone System.

According to local division manager Harold Nelms, the information operators will assist the youth of the community by giving callers the telephone numbers for agencies which are channelling

job and recreation information to the youngsters.

Depending on the community involved, those organizations supplying job information would be either the local Department of Employment office or the Youth Opportunities Center. News about recreational opportunities would come from United Fund or similar agencies.

Foods market parking lot at Prairie Avenue, and Redondo Beach Boulevard, as officers arrived.

As the officers followed the vehicle east on Redondo Beach Boulevard, Officer Turner reported that the suspect threw several objects

out the car window. These were later identified as cigarette paper.

When stopped, the suspect and two other men in the auto were searched. But only Updegraff was charged with possession of the drug when the green leafy substance was found in his pocket.

Canoeing Contest Planned

Canoeing students, who learned to paddle at Alondra Park in Lawndale will be among the 200 participants in water games at Alamitos Bay in Long Beach Saturday, July 29, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

The Alondra Park group is being co-sponsored by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation and the Southwest Canoeing Association.

Students entering the canoeing games must have the equivalent of an American Red Cross Intermediate Swimming Certificate and a basic canoeing knowledge.

Canoeing games are one of the focal points of the Alondra Park program. The event is staged as a bonus for students who have made the effort to learn the art of this water sport as a safety factor and as a form of recreation, according to Norman S Johnson, county parks and recreation director.

Lessons in canoeing are taught at Alondra Park throughout the year, with each session scheduled for eight weeks.

Bids Due For Water Projects

SACRAMENTO—The State Department of Water Resources has called for bids for four projects on the state water project, with a total value of \$875,000.

Bids for three of the projects will be opened in Sacramento Aug. 9. These include: construction of turnout structures along the California aqueduct in Kings and Kern counties, between Kettleman City and 7th Standard Road, and along the coastal branch of the aqueduct, between Avenal Gap and Devil's Den pumping plant, expected to cost \$300,000; construction of a pipeline and appurtenances from the federal Solano project terminal reservoir for about 2500 feet to the Cordelia surge tank, as part of the North Bay aqueduct, expected to cost \$250,000; and relocation of U.S. forest services roads for 4.3 miles about 15 miles northeast of Oroville, in the Big Bend area, expected to cost \$325,000.

Bids will be opened Aug 2 for realignment and improvement of 9 miles of Glen Drive and 500 feet of Orr Dam Boulevard, about two miles east of Oroville expected to cost \$100,000.
