

# Contract Awarded for Carson Area Road Work

A contract has been awarded to the Griffith Co. of Los Angeles for the improvement of Torrance Boulevard between Normandie Avenue and the Harbor Freeway, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said today.

Construction under the \$159,845 contract is slated for completion in October.

Work will consist of reconstructing and widening the one-mile section to provide a four-lane, curbed highway within an 80-foot right-of-way with curb, gutter, sidewalk, pavement, drives, roadway drainage structures, and sewer work.

# Medicare Marks First Birthday

An important and historic birthday came and went July 1, probably unnoticed by most residents of the South Bay area, according to Miles Davis, district manager at the Torrance Social Security office.

July 1 marked the first anniversary of Medicare, Davis said. At the time the program was begun, Davis said, there were predictions that hospitals would suddenly become overcrowded with Medicare patients and that there would be long waiting periods for people under 65 to be admitted to a hospital.

"Such predictions simply did not come true," Davis said.

He said a recent check with South Bay hospitals by the Social Security Administration revealed that not one of the hospitals was full.

To many area residents 65 or older, Medicare has meant they have the best hospital

and medical care at very low cost, Davis said. Many, he added, have had major surgery which was long postponed because of financial inability to pay for the necessary treatments.

Davis emphasized that persons nearing 65 who have never applied for Social Security monthly benefits because they are still working should apply for Medicare coverage during the three-month period before the month in which they become 65.
