

Drunk Driving Suspect Held by Alert Witness

An alert Torrance resident aided police in the arrest of an accused hit-and-run driver Sunday on charges of felony drunk driving when he followed the suspect's auto after it allegedly hit a parked car at 2721 Arlington Ave.

Twenty-one-year-old Gary Heffner, 1518 W. 252nd St., Harbor City, was taken into custody by Torrance police at Cabrillo Avenue and 235th Place after Elwood Simpson, 28, of 2113 W. 236th Place, stopped Heffner's vehicle and held him for police.

Simpson told police that he saw Heffner's auto eastbound on 229th Street and followed it after it allegedly ran a red light on Arlington Avenue. Heffner's auto apparently went out of control after turning the corner and narrowly missed a parked truck parked at the curb before hitting the east curb on Arlington Avenue.

The vehicle was reported to then cross the street and hit a parked car belonging to Raymond Hacker, 2721 Arlington Ave. Witnesses said two men got out and looked at the damage, but then sped from the scene.
