One of my favorite museums is the Long Beach Museum of Art. All of my drawing and painting students at El Camino College are required to make a field trip to Long Beach and report on the particular exhibition they see. During this past week I visited the museum to see the exciting sixth annual Southern California Exhibition.

There are 79 works consisting of paintings, prints and sculpture that were selected from 510 entries. Pointing to the rising importance of the museum is the selection of the sole juror, Clement Greenberg, considered by the majority of the art world as the most important art critic in America today.

(Continued from Page C-6) Here now, Smith Bros. Indian Village, as you know, has been family headquarters for holiday dining in the Torrance area for many years and they're still swinging the same this year.

Mr. Greenberg's selection must be shocking to many people—not only to the shuffling, perplexed ones who can't understand Vic Smith's prize winner but also to the young, experimenters who just don't "dig" works that are done in the old traditional manner such as Jean Swiggett's "Victorian Interior." It is indeed surprising to see such an exhibition as this being equally made up of abstract and representational works.

And by way of making the point, Easter Sunday brunch will be served next Sunday from 10 in the morning 'til 2 in the afternoon.

THERE REALLY is something for everyone. This is pleasantly unusual, yet I wonder whether everyone will be satisfied. It becomes apparent that works can be judged by one set of criteria—and that these works can be diametrically opposed in content and direction and still be exhibited next to each other—whether we personally like or dislike them.

There'll be the traditional and tantalizing hot and cold foods served buffet style in the Pow-Wow Room during these hours at a price of \$2.45 per each, including beverage. And for a dollar and a quarter the papooses can stuff themselves, provided they're under 6 years of age.

There were many paintings and sculptures that excited me—and a number of others that were not suited to my taste. George Nicolaidis' "Orange Crush" is a combination of huge oranges, collaged on canvas with a background of wild color. I liked the audacity and arresting stimulation of this painting—so much so, that I went out and bought a bag of oranges.

Then we get into the dinner menu which will be offered from one p.m. 'til ten in the evening, featuring complete dinners of traditional baked ham and roast turkey, as well as a variety of seafood, delicious prime rib and juicy steaks.

An intriguing sculpture, "Shoestring" by John W. Outerbridge, seems to provoke a whimsical reaction in most viewers. I liked it, yet I would probably have named it something else. The graphics are not ignored. There is an intaglio by Alice L. Patt titled, "Scheherazade," that almost sings with its rich reds.

Yes, the kiddies'll be taken care of, naturally, and there's plenty of high chairs available. Be sure you make some reservations, however, for this Sunday. They'll very likely be pretty well swamped.

RICHARD KLIX has painted patterns with liquitex, glass and polyester and the result is a special luminosity that defies description. Accro Easter featuring a tossed rlyric and luminous spray were used by P. Bender-Shore in painting "Coed," and this really was one of my favorites. The very expressive "The Captain" by Alice Leonard, one of the Southland's most creative painters, is a treat to see—it is in the downstairs gallery.

Winners share \$4,000 in cash awards. That is a great deal of money for a museum of this size to offer—which emphasizes the growing importance of the museum. Prize winners included Vic Smith, Westminster; Robert Gore, Nick Boismert, Wilma Boyer, Ann Schechter, Los Angeles; Thomas J. Holste, Laguna Beach; Alexander Lapidus, San Pedro; Bernard Wynne Sierra Madre, and E. Tom Daniel, Walnut.

Then you top the whole thing off with some of the most famous Red Balloon apple pie (and it's delicious!) with your choice of tea or coffee. And the whole shot goes off at a mere \$1.99. The kids may dine on kid's portions for 99¢ and they'll love it!

Why not make a day of it and help the good folk at the Red Balloon judge the Easter Bonnets that'll be modeled by the charming waitresses on that day!

So to wind up this Easter bit let's not forget the action at the Torrance Ramada Inn for this Sunday!

This exhibition will be shown until May 5, so there is enough time to plan a visit. The Long Beach Museum of Art is at 2300 E. Ocean Blvd., Long Beach. It is free to the public and is open Tuesday through Friday from 10 to 5 and Saturday and Sunday from 1 to 5. The museum is closed Mondays.

You'll have a full course dinner starting at two and a quarter which will be served all day and you can bring the kiddies in (under 12, that is) for a dollar less!
