Drug Arrests in State Reach Eight-Year Peak

SACRAMENTO—Drug arrests in California skyrocketed in 1967 for both adults and juveniles, setting a new record for the eight years in which records have been kept and showing the highest year-to-year gain.
 A total of 47,032 adult drug arrests were made, a gain of 66.4 per cent over 1966. On the juvenile scene, the total was 14,760, an increase of 175.6 per cent over the 5,355 arrests made in 1966.
 For both adults and juveniles, marijuana arrests showed the highest rate of increase, the report of the state justice department said.

For adult arrests, marijuana offenses were up 86.7 per cent; dangerous drugs up 7.6 per cent; heroin and other narcotics up 28.7; and narcotic addict-user arrests were up 28.8 per cent.
 Juvenile marijuana arrests jumped from 4,034 in 1966 to 10,987 in 1967, an increase of 172.4 per cent. Dangerous drug arrests were up from 1,007 to 2,809, a gain of 178.9 per cent. Heroin and other narcotic offenses increased from 61 to 134 and narcotic addict-user arrests climbed from 57 to 138.
 As in previous years, the greatest frequency of drug arrests was observed in the 17-year-old category.

Cancer Crusade Plans Residential Campaign

The American Cancer Society's current month-long crusade against cancer—to be further accelerated by a concentrated four-day residential campaign set for Friday through Monday—is almost certain to set new records this year, Chairman O. Rey Rule said this week.

As chairman of the district crusade, Rule reported significant gains on three fronts—money contributed to fight cancer, the total number of personal contacts made by crusade volunteers, and the number of educational leaflets distributed to the public. At the end of the first week, \$44,000 in contributions—representing 40 per cent of the district's \$115,000 goal—already had been tabulated.

leaders throughout the district's 23 communities are "highly encouraged" by the 1968 showing. Rule announced that some 3,000 residential volunteers will concentrate on making door-to-door contacts from Friday, April 19, through Monday, April 22, in a concerted effort to add maximum impetus to the crusade before it winds up April 30.

Persons wishing to join the four-day residential venture are urged to contact the district's American Cancer Society office at 16503 Hawthorne Blvd., Lawndale.

Assuming a dual role, neighborhood crusaders distribute literature outlining cancer warning signals while accepting contributions in support of the society's programs in research, education and service to cancer patients.

RULE POINTED out that 1,400,000 living Americans know from their own experience that cancer can be cured. "These people have gone five years or more without recurrence of the disease," he said. "They have learned that when discovered and treated early cancer can be cured."


