at last month's Planning Commission meeting. William Borton, 3116 Winlock Road, president of the Waleria Homeowners' Association, merely stated that area residents objected to a continuance of the hearing. The question, he said, has been "postponed time and again" since it was first brought up in 1966.

OWNERS of the dump site are entitled to submit their request for a variance again in six months. Councilmen considered taking steps to halt discussion of the unpopular dump question in future months and years, but decided against such a measure.

City Attorney Stanley E. Remelmeier said that a change in the city's basic regulations would stymie the dump proponents. But the change would have to be applied to every citizen's requests, he explained.

mino Real and Juanita Street, the cars were eastbound with Miss Krug's car in the left lane.

Police said DeWaide advanced in the right lane. Beyond the turn in the road, the boys' car went up a curb shoulder, sprayed a cloud of dirt, went out of control, and moved across the two paved lanes ahead of the vehicle driven by Miss Krug.

When DeWaide's car struck the oncoming Torino, DeWaide was thrown through the windshield and struck his head on the grill of the other car, police said.

THE CHEVY II pivoted when struck again by the Krug car and authorities assume it was during these moments that Reed and Matthews were thrown from either side of the car. The Torino was struck again by the westbound Thunderbird and Reed was pinned under the Torino.

An unidentified man who first reached the scene helped the six children from the Torino, but he was unable to move Mrs. Terry. She was taken away in an ambulance 30 minutes after the collision. The Torino had to be raised
