

CERRITOS IS HOST TO MEET

Top track and field competitors from Southern California will perform at Cerritos College this week in prelims and finals of the Southern California Junior College championships. Preliminary competition is scheduled to begin in Cerritos Stadium today. The top seven in field events and top nine in running events will proceed to the finals Saturday night. The finals are slated to start at 6:30 p.m. and continue through the evening hours. Running events will not start until 7:30 p.m. The top four finishers in each of the final field events and top six in each of the running events will qualify for the state track meet at Modesto, May 25. Athletes competing at Cerritos this week will be the top six finishers from the Metropolitan, Western States, Eastern and Pacific Southwest conferences plus the event champions from the Desert Conference.

Sprint Cars Compete at Ascot Park


Bobby Hogle of Buena Park will shoot for his fifth CRA sprint car feature win of the year Saturday night at Gardena's Ascot Park. He meets a field of 50 of the West's top drivers in an eight event sprint car racing card. Hogle will face five other drivers who have scored California Racing Association feature wins this year. They are Paul Jones of Torrance, Billy Wilkerson of El Monte, Carl Adams of El Cajon, Bob McCoy of San Diego and last Saturday night's main event winner, Ned Spath of Ojai. Hogle has two wins and two second place finishes to his credit at Ascot this year, plus two other CRA wins at other tracks. He will be behind the wheel of the three-time CRA championship winning Morales Bros. Offenhauser powered "Tamale Wagon" from Anaheim. The car has been driven to wins in the past by such speedway stars as Parnelli Jones, A. J. Foyt, Chuck Hulse, and Billy Vukovich.

Five Turbine Cars Scratched

At the Indianapolis Speedweek, sound-proof turbine race cars continue to drown out piston engines as preparations intensify for the Memorial Day 500. Andy Granatelli, president of STP, announced that No. 40, the pot-bellied turbocar that started all the controversy last year by staging a runaway for 492 1/2 of the 500 miles, has been withdrawn from the race. Turbine representation in the 500 is fast dwindling. Of the nine originally entered, five have been scratched. Last week Carroll Shelby withdrew his three GE-powered cars "for reasons of safety." A brush with the wall Sunday left the STP car too badly damaged to make repairs "justified." Driver Joe Leonard was unhurt in the 166 m.p.h. crash after "hitting a helluva bump and losing control," said an STP spokesman in describing the accident. The car, which was driven last year by Parnelli Jones is being trucked to Santa Monica, where it was built, and will be placed in permanent retirement. "It will be reassembled as a museum piece," Granatelli said Monday. Rebuilding it is not justified since the car is not eligible to run after this year's race. It is not worth the expense in man hours. Instead, Granatelli said

West High is scheduled to meet Rolling Hills in its first CIF playoff baseball game Friday. The game will be at Rolling Hills Field. The game matches Daryl Arenstein (8-0) of Rolling Hills against either Jim Mullens or Glen Males on the mound for West.

Hollypark \$100,000 Race Set

Hollywood Park will be the scene of an intersectional battle Saturday when the Inglewood "track of the lakes and flowers" presents the 15th running of the \$100,000 added California, first of five "hundred granders" on the 1968 Hollypark stakes agenda. Representing the east in the Californian will be the well-traveled Barbs Delight, the four-year-old son of Bagdad who thrilled millions of racing fans last year when he almost stole the Kentucky Derby before finishing second to Proud Clarion. Barbs Delight has been runner-up to In Reality in his two most recent starts, one being a track-record effort for a mile and one-sixteenth, the Californian distance. The other was in the \$111,000 John B. Campbell Handicap. Barbs Delight, who raced against the best three-year-olds in the country all during 1967, already has performed this year at Hialeah and Gulfstream Park in Florida, Oaklawn Park in Arkansas and Bowie in Maryland. Several thoroughbreds are expected to carry the west's hopes in the Californian, but those considered to have the best chance are Tumble Wind, Gemely and Rising Market. Tumble Wind always has run big races at Hollywood Park, where he was one of the meet's stars as a two-year-old in 1966 and champion of the three-year-olds last season when he won a pair of stakes, including the \$117,900 Hollywood Derby. Gemely, 1967 "three-year-old filly of the year" and well on her way to additional national laurels this year, will be the first distaffer to start in the Californian since Silver Spoon in 1960. Gemely captured the Wilshire Handicap in her first local outing and earlier this year won the Santa Maria Handicap and \$100,000 Santa Margarita at Santa Anita. Rising Market, one of the greatest colts to race in Southern California in many years, captured the first division of the \$54,550 Los Angeles Handicap in his last start and also won the \$88,000 Santa Antonio Stakes at Santa Anita. The Californian lineup is also expected to include such proven stakes performers as Dr. Roy E., Son Jack, Most Host, Bold Tactics and Aurelius II.

Young Moves To Harbor JC

Bill Young, head football coach at Westchester High, will come to Harbor College in September as an assistant coach. At Westchester, Young won Western League titles in 1961, 1963, 1965, and 1967. Last year his team took the city championship, defeating Gardena in the finals, and in 1965 Westchester was second in city.

Torrance Soccer Team To Play Northerners

The American Youth Soccer Organization announced that the Mustangs, second division champions of Torrance region, have been matched with the La Honda Bandits for a two-game series Saturday and Sunday. In order to give their Northern California opponents a real battle, Coach Willie Carson has bolstered his lineup with several key players of the Torrance Hornets, Comets and Cougars. Following their noon match in La Honda Saturday, the Southland reps are invited to a picnic in the Redwoods and overnight stay with their northern hosts. The action moves to Oakland Stadium Sunday, where the Mustangs will play their second game against La Honda in conjunction with the home game of the Oakland Clippers of the NASL. "We are proud of the great strides made by our San Mateo County Region," said Hans F. W. Stierle, AYSO president and Special Games chairman. "Although our official season concluded April 13, the AYSO's regional representative teams will compete in exhibition games until regular league play resumes in October." AYSO teams have several games scheduled at the Pasadena Rose Bowl in conjunction with the Los Angeles Wolves' home games, with further invitations from San Diego, Mexico, Colorado and Salt Lake City, Utah, currently under consideration.
