The 1st Battalion of the 14th Marines, a reserve unit stationed at the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Training Center in Los Angeles, marched off with the Secretary of Defense trophy for the best reserve forces unit entry and with a citizens trophy for the outstanding entry in the open class motorized units. Winning two trophies was the Oxnard Air Force Base Sentry Dog Training Demonstration unit which won the perpetual trophy for the best exhibit area entry and won another trophy as the best combat support exhibit.

TAKING two trophies back to UCLA was its Senior ROTC unit which won the Best ROTC Unit award and the outstanding entry among open class marching units.

Putting happy smiles on the faces of scores of Torrance area families was the double win brought home by the Torrance Area Youth Band—as the best civilian music entry and as the best local entry.

Baltimore Float (with the firing deck guns), best regular forces unit entry.
