

Hooper Issues Debate Challenge to Anderson

Morris Hooper, Republican eight-year record as lieutenant governor," Hooper declared. "It is my position that Anderson doesn't possess the high qualifications for public office that he claims—and the best way to settle the question is to meet in face-to-face debate."

"The Watts riot of 1965 is the one big thing that stands out clearly in Anderson's Hooper, area chairman of the 1966 Reagan-Finch campaign and mayor of Lawndale until he entered the race for Congress, said in a letter to Anderson he will debate him "any time, anywhere."

He disclosed he will set a time and place within a few days if the Democratic candidate fails to agree to a meeting.

"The voters turned him out as lieutenant governor, and it is my prayerful hope they won't even let him get a foot in the door of Congress."

"In these times, we need men in national offices who strongly support the principles of law and order," Hooper said. "By his vacillation and indecisive attitudes, Anderson was in part responsible for the destruction caused by the Watts riot."
