## Whales Seen Off Redondo

Great Gray Whales have been sighted off Redondo Beach. Sightings were reported by Mayor William F. Czuleger, who also said that arrangements have been made for "Whale Hunt Cruises" each Saturday during the migration.

The 150-passenger excursion boat, Voyager, will make the three-hour cruises each Saturday, leaving at 1 p.m. and returning about 4 p.m. Tickets are \$3 for adults and \$2 for children under 12.

The first whales usually arrive off the coast within five days of Dec. 22 to 27, according to Dr. Raymond Gilmore, research curator of marine mammals for the San Diego Museum of Natural History. The main herd requires about six weeks to pass by the Southern California coastline.

The Gray Whale summers in the Bering Sea, where during a four-month period it feeds and lays down heavy layers of fat that must fuel it for the next seven and a half months. The herd spends the winter in the bays and lagoons of Baja California, where they mate and calve.

The whales make the 12,000 to 14,000 mile round trip annually, traveling 60 to 80 nautical miles a day for two to three months. They average about four knots in speed.

A favorite location for the whales in Baja California is Scammon's Lagoon.
