Forum Site of 1968 Home Show

The 1968 Los Angeles Home Show will be held for 11 days, May 9 to 19, in Jack Kent Cooke's Forum, according to Paul C. Calcaterra, 1968 president-elect of the Home Show, and Carl F. Kraatz, executive vice president and managing director. It will be the first major trade show staged in the elaborate \$16 million sports arena.

Sponsored by 14 construction industry associations and the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, the Home Show, now in its 33rd year, is the largest home and building exposition in the nation.

ONE OF THE oldest and most successful, it is a non-profit, public service enterprise. Each year more than 300 exhibitors display their products and services to upward of 250,000 visitors, including home owners, home buyers, builders, contractors, and architects. Kraatz said special consideration will be given to model home and mobile home displays at the 1968 building trades exposition. Exhibit areas totaling 100,000 square feet will be allocated just inside the two main entrances to The Forum grounds, so that all attending would first pass through the full scale Model Home exhibits and a Mobile Home Village before entering the main building.
