Freedom Topic of Lecture

How prayer can help us win our freedom from the prisons of sickness, sin, and lack, will be the subject of a Christian Science lecture in Torrance, Monday, Jan. 8.

Eugene Depold Tyc, C.S., of San Diego, will speak at 8 p.m. in First Church of Christ, Scientist, 218th and Manuel Ave. Given under the auspices of the church, the lecture, entitled "Claim Your Freedom," is open free of charge to the community.

Tyc is a native of Philadelphia, Penn., and was educated in the Philadelphia public schools and the Drexel Institute of Technology.

During World War II, he served in the U. S. Infantry and Military Intelligence. He retired from business in 1957, to give his full time to the healing ministry of Christian Science.

Currently, Tyc is on tour throughout the United States and Canada as a member of The Christian Science Board of Lectureship of The First Church of Christ Scientist, in Boston, Mass.

QUICK APRICOT PASTRIES

- 1 pkg. refrigerated crescent rolls
- 2/3 C. apricot jam
- 1 C. sour cream
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Place the rectangles of dough over the bottom of a 13x9x2" pan to form a single layer of pastry. Crimp the edges of dough together. Spread apricot jam over the dough. Bake at 375 degrees for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, combine the sour cream, beaten egg, sugar, and vanilla. Pour over the jam, reduce temperature to 325 degrees and bake an additional 5 minutes. Other jams or preserves can be substituted for the apricot. Optional: 1/2 C. nut meats may be added.

Cut into 6 or 8 servings. May be served hot or cold.

CHEESY HAM CRESCENTS

- 1 pkg. refrigerated crescent rolls
- 3 thin slices baked ham, cut into thirds
- 1/2 C. grated sharp cheddar cheese

Unroll crescent dough according to directions. Place a piece of ham on each section of dough. Sprinkle with cheese and ham to form crescent shapes, according to package directions. Arrange on baking sheet and bake at 375 degrees for 15-20 minutes. Serve hot.

Edison Co. Will Issue New Bonds

Southern California Edison Co. directors have authorized plans for a \$100 million offering of first and refunding mortgage bonds.

Edison President Jack K. Horton said the issue, Series W, due 1993, is scheduled for bidding Tuesday, Feb. 6.

The electric company expects to file an application with the California Public Utilities Commission next Tuesday requesting authorization to issue and sell the bonds at competitive bidding. Filing of a registration settlement with the Securities and Exchange Commission in Washington, D. C., is planned for Monday, Jan. 8, Horton said.

His Eminence, the Most Holy of the World Council of Churches will officiate at Epiphany Day rites starting at 10:30 a.m. Saturday in the St. Katherine Greek Orthodox Church, 722 Knob Hill, Redondo Beach.



ARCHBISHOP IAKOVOS Plans to Visit Area

The ceremonies will include the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom, followed by the Service of the Blessing of the Waters which commemorates the Baptism of Christ in the River Jordan. The Rev. Father Naoum Nitsiotis, pastor of St. Katherine's will assist the Archbishop during the services and the St. Katherine Choir, under the direction of John Laskaris, will sing the responses.

Following the services, the St. Katherine Community will honor Archbishop Iakovos, at a luncheon at the Lobster House, 685 N. Harbor Drive, Redondo Beach. Among the civic leaders who will be on hand to greet the Archbishop at the luncheon will be Mayor Albert Isen.

This visit will be the Archbishop's first in which he will conduct services for the Orthodox Community here, although he did pay an informal visit to the area several years ago before the present church was constructed.

Sunday, His Eminence will celebrate the Divine Liturgy assisted by Orthodox clergy from throughout the Los Angeles area at the Long Beach Municipal Auditorium at 10:30 a.m.

Then at 12:30 p.m., he will conduct the Blessing of the Waters at Rainbow Lagoon and following centuries-old tradition will cast a small wooden cross into the waters, as a score of young men dive from nearby boats to retrieve it. The youth recovering the cross will then kneel before the Archbishop and receive a special blessing, as well as the gift of the cross.

Archbishop Iakovos is a leader in the ecumenical movement. Prior to becoming the ranking prelate of more than two million Greek Orthodox Christians in the Americas in 1959, he served as

the personal representative of His Holiness Athenagoras I, Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople, to the World Council of Churches in Geneva. The Archbishop served as a priest for many years in this country and is a graduate of the Harvard Divinity School in Boston.


