

# Shoplifters Cost Nation's Retail Firms \$500 Million

'Tis the season when police and store managers have their hands full, or rather empty, trying to thwart or deal effectively with the thousands of persons who are busy getting something for nothing — the shoplifter.

It has been estimated that the period between Thanksgiving and Christmas will be found to have produced more than four million cases of shoplifting. Many stores are investing large sums in protection against this pandemic sleight-of-hand, which will cost the nation's merchants approximately \$500 million this season.

Store managers have little choice but to step up their surveillance. "We don't want to harass our customers, but unfortunately we have to be very wary of every one of them," says a security chief of one large department store on the West Coast.

MANY STORES have turned to electronic devices. A store in New York that has been using such a unit reports that it has cut shoplifting by more than 50 per cent.

Generally, store managers still believe their sales staff is their first line of defense, but some security officials

wryly observe that "it is the one line that can be breached." Indeed, some of them regard the sales staff as a prime source of trouble, especially during the holiday season. The internal shoplifter, sometimes known as the "white collar thief," knows the store's security arrangements and how to circumvent them. As one security manager put it recently, "one dishonest employe could cost the store hundreds of dollars in merchandise and cash assets."

**CONTINUED GROWTH** in demand for credit by consumers is predicted by the chairman of one of the nation's largest consumer-credit firms — Universal C.I.T. Credit Corp.

Alan G. Rude, forecasts that consumer credit outstanding will rise about the \$100-billion mark for the first time around mid-1968 and keep right on going up. Consumer credit embraces the financing of such things as automobiles, boats, refrigerators and many other items. It also refers to loans to individuals made by finance companies, banks and other financial institutions.

What's behind the optimism for this type of credit? Rude notes that the growth in

the 20- to 24-year-old group, now at 2.8 per cent, will expand to 5.3 per cent a year by 1970 — and that's the age group when most people get married and need credit for a multitude of goods.

Are people borrowing too much? The finance executive answers by noting that borrowers have established an excellent credit record with Universal C.I.T. in both good times and bad. "The American people can be counted upon to meet their obligations," he says.

One bright spot in your next visit to the hospital may be your room, for hospitals are shedding their drab institutional look in favor of patient rooms reflecting a homelike atmosphere.

"Hospital administrators have discovered that tastefully decorated rooms can improve the patient's outlook and may help speed recovery," said Blaz Lucas, executive vice president of Borg-Warner's Ingersoll Products division, manufacturer of electric hospital beds.

**IN ADDITION** to high-style traditional or period furniture, many hospital rooms now are graced with color-coordinated walls and carpeting, color television, air conditioning and private baths, Lucas said.

In response to this growing demand for stylish patient room furniture, Lucas said, arrangements have been made for the Drexel Furniture Co. to produce a line of hospital-room furniture to complement the Borg-Warner beds, which are patterned after styles popular in fashionable homes.

## Senator Seeks to Ease Penalties For Drivers Who Use Car in Work

**SACRAMENTO** — Senator Randolph Collier (D-Yreka) said he plans to introduce a bill during the current session of the legislature designed to ease the penalty for drunk driving for persons who must use a vehicle in order to make a living.

Collier authored the bill in 1966 to require persons to submit to drunk driver tests or lose their drivers licenses — known as the "implied consent" law.

Collier said he does not have all of the specifics worked out in his bill of this year but it generally would transfer considerable jurisdiction in handling drunk driver cases from the Department of Motor Vehicles to the courts.

"We're talking generally about first or second offenses," Collier said. "The

bill would permit a judge to provide the jail sentence imposed because of the drunk driving conviction could be served on weekends. This would permit the man to continue his work so his family would be supported."

Collier indicated the bill also would give more discretion to the courts in providing for a non-suspension of driving privileges for drivers

convicted on the offense who make their living driving vehicles. The senator's program appears to be going in different directions from that proposed generally by Governor Ronald Reagan. In his "state of the state" message, Reagan asked for legislation setting presumptive limits on alcohol
