

## Feud Between Youths Ends in Felony Hit-Run

An 18-year-old Torrance plumber suffered injuries to his left leg Saturday evening after he was run down by a car following an argument.

Rushed to Harbor General Hospital was Vincent F. Chavez of 18509 Van Ness.

Witnesses told police that Chavez had been standing on the sidewalk talking to three boys in a car in the driveway of the Grand Theater parking lot on Cravens Avenue. Suddenly, the car backed away, hitting Chavez, police said.

The victim ran into the street, yelling at the driver. The car then swerved and hit him a second time, knocking him to the ground, police reported.

The car's three occupants were apprehended a short time later by Torrance police after an elusive chase. All three were arrested for felony hit and run and assault with a deadly weapon.

The boys were believed to be under the influence of some intoxicating drug, police said.

The 16-year-old driver told police that an argument was going on, although he denied deliberately running down the youth.

## Sanity Test Ordered in Murder Trial

Sanity tests have been ordered for a 38-year-old man accused of killing a California Highway Patrolman.

Thomas Eugene Spychala, 38, was ordered to return to court, when psychiatric reports have been completed. Superior Court Judge Bernard Lawler set Feb. 21 for Spychala to make a plea to the charges.

Spychala is accused of killing Merle Lee Andrews, 39, last Dec. 20 after luring the officer into a shoot-out in the hope of fulfilling his own death wish.




