Mr. Stevens, who was educated at the University of Michigan and Eastman School of Music, is also leading flutist for the Hollywood Bowl and Columbia Symphonies. He is a member of the faculties of USC, Occidental and Claremont colleges, as well as Music Academy of the West.

A duo-harp team includes Mr. Chaloupka, first harpist in the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and his wife, Paula Schertzinger, who is the daughter of the last Victor Schertzinger, noted composer, and motion picture director. She has been under contract to Paramount and MGM studios, has performed on radio and television and plays in the Philharmonic with her husband.
