

Civic Leader Succumbs; Rites Scheduled Sunday

Mrs. Ethel Mae Mosley, wife of the 1967 YMCA Good Neighbor, died yesterday in a Los Angeles hospital following an illness of several months.

Mrs. Mosley, 55, had been active in civic affairs since coming to Torrance in 1946.

A member of the city's Library Commission, Mrs. Mosley was born Sept. 29, 1912, in Davis Okla. She was appointed to the Library Com-

mission in May, 1966.

Her husband, J. R. (Burke) Mosley, was named winner of the 1967 YMCA Good Neighbor award. Both he and Mrs. Mosley were active in a number of civic and community projects.

Mrs. Mosley was a member of the First Christian Church of Torrance. The family home is at 23846 Ward St.

Funeral services will be conducted Sunday afternoon at the First Christian Church. The Rev. H. Milton Sippel, pastor, will officiate. Arrangements are being handled by the A. M. Gamby Mortuary of Lomita.

In addition to her husband, Mrs. Mosley is survived by her father, John Bounds of Davis, Okla.; a brother, John Bounds Jr. of Tallequa, Okla.; and a sister, JoAnn Puckett of Torrance.

In Vietnam, he said, negotiation is not the answer. Sciarrotta believes that the U.S. should make an effort to win the war as soon as possible. Russia, he added, is trying to prolong the war, hoping that it will lead to a total conflict between the United States and China.

IN THE realm of taxation, Sciarrotta favors the new surtax as long as the government holds its spending within budget limits. He hopes that one day there will be only one tax—an income tax—reminding the public that 33 cents of each dollar earned now goes for one tax or another.

A resident of Torrance for the past 18 years, Sciarrotta is an instructor of political science at Long Beach City College. He holds a bachelor's degree from Ohio State University and a master's from the University of Pittsburgh in chemistry and political science.

The 17th Congressional District takes in portions of east and north Torrance as well as many surrounding communities.






