

Anti-Smut Bills Aimed At Protecting Children

SACRAMENTO — Another drive to tighten restrictions against distribution of obscene material has been started by Senator Robert J. Lagomarsino (R-Ojai), but this session he will confine his efforts to preventing sale of pornography to persons under 18.

Lagomarsino said his bill was drafted by Evelle J. Younger's office, the district attorney of Los Angeles County, and was similar to legislation he carried during the 1967 session. It had been supported by Governor Ronald Reagan and Attorney General Thomas C. Lynch.

Last year, two Lagomarsino

bills cleared the senate easily — one tightening the general laws on pornography and the other aimed at sales to persons under 18. However, the bills were killed in the Assembly Committee on Criminal Procedure.

THAT COMMITTEE is almost identical in membership bills were killed in the Assemblyman John Vasconcellos (D-San Jose) has replaced Assemblyman Walter J. Karabin (D-Monterey Park). Karabin had opposed Lagomarsino's bill in 1967, but this year, is a co-author of the measure.

Assemblyman Robert W. Crown (D-Alameda), a prominent member of the criminal procedure committee, said he had no idea how the bill might fare this year.

"I wouldn't want to predict the outcome of any bill in that committee at this time," Crown said. "But with the

membership split the way it is (five liberals and five conservatives), it's tough for either side to get a bill out of it."

CROWN NOTED he had introduced again his bills calling for state financing of the purchase of uniforms and equipment for local police and sheriff's officers, his main program for law enforcement. But this bill also failed to make the grade last year.

Another member of the Assembly Criminal Procedure Committee, Assemblyman John T. Knox (D-Richmond), had introduced a countermeasure in 1967. Knox said he introduced his bill, also aimed at sales to persons under 18, as a compromise because he could not vote for the Lagomarsino bill. Knox said he had not seen the latest version of the senator's bill and didn't know if he

would foster a counter measure again this year. Lagomarsino said his bill would make it a misdemeanor for any person to knowingly sell, loan, or distribute, to a person under 18 any pornographic materials. "Harmful matter" is defined in the bill as matter which, taken as a whole, predominantly appeals to prurient, shameful, or morbid interest of minors in nudity, sex, or sexually deviant practices, is patently offensive to contemporary standards in the adult community as a whole with respect to its suitability for minors and is of slight redeeming social importance for minors.

THE PRESENT law provides material is not obscene unless it is utterly without redeeming social importance.

The bill also would prohibit selling tickets of admission to minors for premises where pornographic matter is ex-

hibited, and would prohibit sending, delivering or giving away any advertisement offering to sell or exhibit for monetary consideration any pornographic material.

Lagomarsino said his bill is based on suggestions of the U.S. supreme court:

"We recognize the legitimate and indeed exigent interests of states and localities throughout the nation in preventing the dissemination of material deemed harmful to children. But that interest does not justify a total suppression of such material, the effect of which would be to reduce the adult population to reading only what is fit for children."


Torrance Cook to Face Attempted Rape Charges


