

Convention Delegate Selected

Mrs. Carolyn Spaulding, Sunday School Superintendent of the Harbor City Four-square Church, will be an official delegate at the International Foursquare Convention. The gathering will be held today through Feb. 14 at Angelus Temple, Los Angeles.

Episcopal Diocese Sets 73rd Annual Convention

The Rt. Rev. Francis Eric Bloy, Bishop of Los Angeles, will set the tone for the 73rd annual convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles when he delivers his annual address Friday evening.

The annual meeting will be held at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles.

Some 1,000 delegates, clergy and lay, representing 186 parishes and missions in eight Southern California counties will gather at the convention, the highest legislation body in the diocese.

THE REV. Hugh R. Percy, rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, will head the delegation from his parish. Other delegates who will attend include Reid L. Bundy, editor and co-publisher of the Press-Herald; James E. Davis; Byron L. Kimball Jr.; Louis Kimzey; and George Packman.

The convention will open with the Convention Eucharist, with the Rt. Rev. Robert C. Rusack, Suffragan Bishop of Los Angeles, as the celebrant. It is scheduled for 5 p.m. Friday.

The convention dinner, at which Bishop Bloy will speak, is scheduled for 7 p.m.

SATURDAY'S session is scheduled for 9 a.m. and is expected to continue until about 4:30 p.m. Principal business is the adoption of a 1968 budget and the passing of the diocesan program for the year. A budget of \$1,717,700 has been proposed, compared to \$1,489,495 for the current fiscal year.

Delegates also will be asked to consider changes in the constitution and canons of the diocese. Proposed amendments to the constitution include a provision for a second Suffragan Bishop. The change was approved last year, but such changes require adoption at two consecutive conventions.
