A. Bus service is infrequent because not enough people use the service. RTD operates entirely from the fare box; they receive no subsidy from the city or county.

Q. I live in Manhattan Beach and I want to visit some friends in Pasadena. I would want to go on Sunday. What bus or buses do I take? L. J.

A. The 51 line from Manhattan Beach to 6th and Spring and the 70-71 line from there to Pasadena, I'll send you both timetable and a map.

Q. We live toward the center of the Palos Verdes area just off of Crenshaw and there doesn't seem to be any bus service. Can you tell me why. Mrs. C.A.M.

A. This is a relative question, but the two most important factors are the winding, narrow streets and the secluded living most people in that area enjoy. It just is not practical to operate bus lines in that area.

Q. How long does it take to go into Los Angeles from Westchester? I want to go to the IBM building for several weeks. C.P.

A. The 51 line takes about 45 minutes to Los Angeles and the 83 out Wilshire takes about 25 minutes. Allow about an hour and a half at the outside.



First Art Festival Planned
