GOP Women Set Coffee Session

"The Women Behind the Candidates" will be theme for tomorrow when the Del Amo Republican Women gather for a membership coffee at the Latitude 20 Restaurant, 3901 W. Pacific Coast Hwy.

Laurel Martin of KLAC Radio will be featured speaker. Mrs. Martin, a native Californian, has been active in the Republican Party for more than 20 years. She served on the Nixon for President Committee in 1960 and was active in the 1964 campaign in Californians for Goldwater.

A commentator on KLAC Radio, she is the 1966 winner of the Betsy Ross Award for her contributions to freedom. Mrs. Martin also is a board representative of Parents for Better Education.

Mills Enters Race for Board of Supervisors

Los Angeles City Councilman Billy G. Mills announced Monday he will oppose Supervisor Kenneth Hahn in the Second Supervisorial District.

Mills, 37, has represented the eighth district on the Los Angeles City Council since July 1, 1963, and is chairman of the Los Angeles County Democratic Central Committee.

In announcing his candidacy, Mills said he was responding to a 4-month campaign by a draft committee which has been urging him to seek the seat.

"During the next four months," Mills said, "I will address myself to the specific issues which affect the entire second district, from Torrance to downtown Los Angeles, Watts and Willowbrook to Culver City. The common problems vary only in intensity."

He cited leadership, tax relief and reform, cooperation among various levels and agencies of government, and development of community goals through involvement of residents of the district as the principal problems of the area.

The Second District ranges from Downtown Los Angeles south to Carson Street and from the Lakewood area to Culver City and includes all or part of Torrance, the new city of Carson, Gardena, Inglewood and the Centinela Valley cities, as well as a major portion of South and South-Central Los Angeles.

- April 30: "Public and Private Universities: Partners or Competitors?" by Dr. Paul D. Saltman, former USC professor of biochemistry who is now the Provost of Ravelle College, University of California, San Diego.

- May 27: "Modern China's Nuclear Threat," by Dr. William Van Cleave, USC assistant professor of International Relations, formerly with the Strategic Studies Center, Stanford Research Institute.




