## Competition Opens for Annual Essay Contest

The Pep Boys today announced the opening of their 16th annual Four-Year Engineering Scholarship competition. This scholarship, providing tuition, books, and supplies for a four-year term, is open to all high school seniors graduating in June 1968. It may be utilized at any state college or university.

The primary qualifications for the scholarship competition are scholastic standing and a traffic safety essay contest. Murray Rosenfeld, executive vice president and general manager of the Pep Boys, said entry blanks for the competition can now be obtained from senior high school class counselors.

Contest deadline is Feb. 23, 1968. Trophies and U. S. Savings Bonds will be awarded to three students writing the best essays on the theme: "What I Would Do to Prevent Traffic Accidents and Save Lives."

"Winners will be determined by the application of four judging factors," Rosenfeld stated. "These are the excellence of the essay, scholarship standing, good citizenship and score on a special college entrance examination."

Judges for the essay competition will be Evelle J. Younger, Los Angeles District Attorney; Joseph Kaplan, executive vice president of the Los Angeles Chapter of the National Safety Council; Inspector Howard Amborn of the California Highway Patrol; Cecil Zaun, supervisor of the safety and driver instruction section of the Los Angeles City Schools; and Deputy District Attorney Allan H. McCurdy.

"INCREASED attention is being directed by the public and all levels of government to the problems of traffic safety," Rosenfeld said.
