## AAA PLAYOFFS

### North Seeded Third In 32-Team Tourney

North High will oppose Palos Verdes Tuesday night in the first round of the CIF basketball playoffs. The game will be at North High.

Coach Skip Enger's North Saxons finished their Bay League season last Wednesday with a 12-0 record. The final game ended in a 118-56 rout for North. The score is a

school record for most points in a single game.

North went all the way with the first unit and Bill Taylor scored 44 points. It was his career high.

Jim Nielson had 20 points, Dan Anderson 19, Jim Thomas 16, and Dan Hansen 13 points. Redondo finished second with a 10-2 record, losing twice to North. The Seahawks

Jim Owens of the Spartans finished his prep career with 28 points against the Cougars.



Batting clean up, Mike singled his first time at bat and later made an awkward slide into home plate. He first started a slide, thought about going around the catcher who was in front of the plate, and finally went in low, hooking his foot.
