Carson Voters Rate New Votomatic Device Good

Thanks to the voters of Carson, Los Angeles County not only has a brand new city, but also a good indication of how well the new automatic voting devices work.

Approximately 2,230 voters in the Carson area cooperated Feb. 6 in answering a questionnaire after using the IBM Votomatic which will be in each of the county's 7,000 polling places in the June and November elections.

An overwhelming 96.9 per cent said they preferred the new punch-card system over the old paper ballot.

A near-unanimous 99.2 per cent found the system easy to learn and use, although only 15 per cent had actually tried a demonstration voting device prior to coming to the polls.

HOWEVER, 79 per cent knew in advance of the Votomatic—17.9 per cent from newspapers; 14.3 per cent from displays, 13.9 per cent from public speakers; 6 per cent from television; and 3 per cent from radio. One of the main reasons of the Board of Supervisors decided to institute the new

voting system, in addition to economy, was speed.

The voters of Carson gave the new devices top marks on that department.

ONLY 2.3 per cent said the old paper ballots were faster.

More than 90 per cent said there was "no waiting" before their turn to step into the voting booth. About 7 per cent had to wait from one to five minutes and less than 1 per cent waited longer than that.

After entering the booth, 89 per cent voted in less than four minutes.

NEARLY-COMPLETE election returns (with only one precinct missing) were available within 2½ hours after the polls closed in Carson. Election officials estimate they wouldn't have been done
