## City Nets \$49,022 in New Funds

**SACRAMENTO** — State Controller Houston I. Flournoy announced today that Los Angeles County's share of cigarette taxes distributed in January was \$160,829.

The city of Torrance received \$49,022 in the January distribution, Flournoy said.

The statewide distribution amounted to \$5,895,673 to the cities and counties. This was 30 per cent of the revenue deposited in the cigarette tax fund during January from the present tax of 10 cents per package.

# Immunization Can Prevent Whooping Cough in Young

Immediate whooping cough immunizations for young children, particularly infants, have been urged by Dr. G. A. Heidebreder, Los Angeles County Health Officer.

"Now is the time when whooping cough incidence is highest," he warned.

"It is a sad fact," Dr. Heidebreder continued, "that although 30 years have passed since the introduction of a modern whooping cough vaccine, the disease still is present among our children. Too many parents fail to realize that this disease is still a

serious threat, and that immunization starting as early as one month of age is a vital necessity."

**IMMUNIZATION** against whooping cough in the first few weeks of life is particularly important, because infants have no "natural immunity" to the disease. Resistance which babies receive from their mothers to protect against most childhood diseases does not protect against whooping cough. The high rate of fatality among babies who get whooping cough

stresses the importance of starting immunizations as soon as possible.

**MORE THAN 20,000** cases of whooping cough have been reported annually in the United States in the past several years. Every year, 185 persons die from the disease. Almost 70 per cent of the deaths occur in infants under one year of age.

Throughout the United States, 90 per cent of whooping cough deaths occur in children under 3 years of age, 70 per cent in the under 1

year bracket, and 41 per cent of these deaths occur among babies less than 6 months old.

**WHOOPING COUGH** incidence in Los Angeles County has drastically declined in recent years, although the disease still occurs more often than diphtheria, tetanus, polio, and small pox. Dr. Heidebreder said, Through immunization, these diseases have been reduced to less than 15 cases reported last year, while a total of 251 county residents contracted whooping cough.

Whooping cough deaths are rare; however, serious complications are not uncommon. Paroxysmal coughing may damage the lungs and heart. The central nervous system may suffer, both because of the effects on the cerebral blood vessels and because of prolonged periods of asphyxiation.

**IN A TYPICAL** case of whooping cough the symptoms that appear initially are like those of an ordinary cold. There is a slight elevation in temperature and severe dry cough. The severity

of the cough gradually increases until spasmodic coughing develops. It is then that the characteristic whoop is heard. The coughing spasms and whoop often do not occur in very young infants and adults.

The Los Angeles County Health Department recommends a series of three immunizations, one month apart, starting at one month of age. A booster dose about one year after the basic series and another booster on school entry are required for complete protection.
