Employees at the Leo Salisbury Tire Co. have formed a special "Leo Salisbury for Torrance City Council Committee" to assist their employer in his bid for a council seat.

David J. Smith, outside manager, and Richard Potter, inside manager, said they would be sending out campaign literature and making telephone calls to line up votes for Salisbury.

Gibson, Frantz to Seek 17th Congressional Post

A Los Angeles City Councilman and the foreman of the 1967 Los Angeles County Grand Jury have announced they will seek the 17th Congressional seat being vacated by Congressman Cecil R. King.

John S. Gibson Jr., who is serving his fifth term on the Los Angeles City Council, and Lynne A. Frantz Jr., promotion manager of the South Bay Center, announced they will seek the post yesterday. Both will enter the June 4 Democratic primary election.

GIBSON, 65, said he had not made his decision to run until Sunday, "following weeks of urging by prominent citizens." He said he would develop a campaign organization and issue position papers on key issues shortly.

He said the Vietnam war is the key issue. "I favor an early and honorable settlement of it," Gibson added.

A San Pedro resident, he has represented the 15th District on the Los Angeles City

Council for 17 years. From 1953 to 1961 he was elected to four successive terms as council president and currently serves as president pro tem.

AT THE AGE of 21, Gibson was elected mayor of his home town, Geneseo, Kan., and was the youngest mayor in the nation at that time. He has lived in San Pedro since 1927.

Frantz, 37, was born in Iowa and has lived in California since childhood. He lives in Palos Verdes Estates and currently is promotion manager for the South Bay Shopping Center.

Active in the Redondo Beach Chamber of Commerce, he is a past president of that group and of the Junior Chamber. In 1965, he was named Man

of the Year by the Redondo Beach Chamber.

Frantz served as foreman of the 1967 Los Angeles County Grand Jury.
