Day-Long Vietnam Vigil Set

Concern over the war in Vietnam has prompted a Torrance minister to schedule a "Vietnam Prayer Day" Friday, March 29.

Dr. Harold L. Fickett, Sr., interim pastor of the First Baptist Church, 2118 Carson St., said he felt moved to set up the prayer day after hearing a recent newscast on the horrors of the war.

"I got sick to my stomach and then sick at heart," Dr. Fickett said.

In announcing the prayer day to his parishioners, Dr. Fickett related, "If there has ever been a time in our country for prayer, I believe that time is now."

"The church will be open 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. during the 17-hour vigil. No stand will be taken and those from all denominations are invited to participate," Dr. Fickett said.

"The pastor added that response to publicity about the vigil has been "most gratifying." He has received calls from as far away as Pomona commending the church for sponsoring the prayer day.

Adventist Faces Jail For Religious Beliefs

Youth of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church will offer special prayers this weekend for a young Spanish Seventh-day Adventist who faces a six year jail sentence in Spain because of his religious beliefs.

"A special appeal from Adventist Church leaders in Spain has come to our local church youth society to pray for Ruben Escribano, a young Spanish Adventist, who has been sentenced to jail because of his refusal to do ordinary work on Saturday

while serving in the Spanish Army," explained a local Adventist leader.

"Seventh-day Adventists gladly serve in the Armed Forces of their countries," he continued, "but they feel God's law invites only 'good works' of special, helping nature on Saturday, the day of worship of the Seventh-day Adventists."

This is why so many young Adventists serve as medics in the Armed Forces, believing that life-saving work on the Sabbath is in harmony with Divine instruction. Routine work, which young Escribano was ordered to do, cannot be performed on the Sabbath, Adventists hold.

Young people of the Torrance Adventist Church will also be asked to write letters of encouragement to young Escribano. Adventist officials in Spain are appealing his jail sentence to the Spanish Supreme Court.
