

# Extension Classes Offer Variety of Subject Fare

An array of 70 classes ranging in subject from engineering, business administration, and economics to English, psychology and theater arts will be offered by University of California Extension beginning the week of March 25 in seven South Bay locations.

Classes are scheduled in Torrance, Manhattan Beach, Long Beach, Lawndale, Hawthorne and El Segundo and Redondo Beach.

Some 50 classes will open at North High School in Torrance. Business administration classes, include "Elements of Government Contract Administration," beginning Monday, March 25, 7 to 10 p.m. Starting Wednesday, March 27, are "Marketing to Government Agencies," 7 to 10 p.m., "Mathematics for Purchasing," 6:45 to 9:45 p.m., and "Methods and Procedures for Information Systems," 6:45 to 9:45 p.m.

EDUCATION classes will be offered in "Education of Exceptional Children," Mondays beginning March 25, 7 to 10 p.m., and "Psychological Foundations of Education," Wednesday, March 26, "Creative Movement; an Approach to Learning" will meet Tuesday, beginning March 26, 3:45 to 6 p.m.

Of special interest to administrators, purchasing and production personnel, as well as to those who produce proposals for government contracts, "Elements of Government Contract Administration" will meet Monday evenings, 7 to 10 p.m.

"Proposal Preparation," designed for contract administrators, personnel in estimating, purchasing and marketing, and for program and engineering management, is set for Tuesdays, 6:30 to 9:30 p.m.

Harold E. Sharp, contract financial management officer of Space and Missiles Systems Organization, will teach a Thursday night course in

"Government Contract Pricing." Meeting from 7 to 10 p.m., the course will deal with the methodology of pricing, and various types of contracts.

MEETING Monday evenings in North High School, beginning March 25, is "Program Management," a course designed for engineers, managers, systems analysts.

Thomas M. Hatchett, planning advisor, North American Rockwell Corporation, will teach a Wednesday night class at the same location

focusing in "Introduction to Project Planning Techniques." "Systems, Signals and Noise," Tuesday, March 26, 7 to 10 p.m., will apply transfer methods to systems analysis. A special series of ten lectures by UCLA anthropologist James Sackett will explore the "Origins of Man," beginning Monday, March 25, 7:30 to 10 p.m. Music classes in folk guitar and group piano have been scheduled.

THE HUMAN element in business and industry is the subject of a University of California Extension course, "Problems in Human Relations." Weekly sessions meeting 7 to 10 p.m. for 12 weeks will start in North High School March 28.

George B. Parks, president, Merchants Title Company, will conduct a course in "Legal Aspects of Real Estate" Wednesday evenings beginning March 27, 7 to 10 p.m., at North High.
