

Councilmen Spend \$2,400 In Tax Funds for Dinners

A documented charge of some of the councilmen entertained themselves. Asher told newsmen of his findings and supported his claim by producing a document written on an official date for council on the April 9 ballot.

Asher offered proof that certain councilmen spent nearly \$2,500 during the 12 months of 1967. He emphasized that on one evening alone, after the 5:30 council meeting, the lavish entertainment tab at taxpayers expense reached \$163.10 when

supports his accusations is a ledger of food and beverage expense dated on all of the official 5:30 council meeting dates in 1967. The record suggests an average cost in excess of \$14 per person per evening.

The exclusive gatherings in which several, but not all, of the councilmen reportedly participated were held at seven different restaurants, both in and out of Torrance. Dinners and refreshments were charged against the tax funds of the city during 1967 in the amount of \$2,451.10.

"The gravity of this discovery goes far beyond the unbelievably large sums spent for food and drink. It reflects the total disregard for fiscal responsibility which runs rampant in Torrance government today," Asher said. "The hardworking city employees, those officials who refuse to participate in such activities, businessmen, and all property owners are sickened at this misuse of hard-earned tax money," he added.

Funds for Schools Approved

SACRAMENTO — The state Department of Education has announced the first principal apportionment for the support of public schools in California of \$1,223,507,664, including \$384,489,740 for schools in Los Angeles County.

For the county districts, this included \$213,342,690 for elementary schools, \$139,169,372 for high schools and \$29,557,894 for junior colleges.

The apportionment also includes funds for the county school service fund.
