Freeway Monies Approved

SACRAMENTO — Governor Ronald Reagan has lauded a decision which would allocate \$267 million in federal highway funds to construct the Century Freeway in Los Angeles.

The decision was announced by Alan S. Boyd, secretary of transportation.

"I am extremely pleased that our joint efforts to end the three-year stalemate and make this long sought after project a reality have finally come to fruition," Reagan said. "This administration has given the project a top priority for the past 15 months." Reagan said lawmakers were highly instrumental in getting the necessary legislation through congress, especially Senators Thomas H. Kuchel (R-Calif.) and Harold T. Johnson (D-Roseville). Reagan said the federal appropriation will pay some 92 per cent of the cost of building the freeway and the entire state will benefit.

Tips on Flea Control Help to Combat Pests

At this time of year it is not uncommon for residents in various parts of the county to experience an infestation of fleas in their home and yards. The usual targets of this insect are cats and dogs, but it will readily bite people also. One may well be suspicious

that fleas are the source of itching bites when these bites occur about the feet and ankles, as the insect is most frequently found on the ground or floor. Infants and young children who play on the floor may be bitten anywhere on the body. The discomfort of flea bites may be temporarily alleviated by the application of ice, or by use of a soothing medication recommended by one's family physician. Repeated bites stimulate an allergic response in some individuals so that subsequent bites are more severe than the first.

Whether individuals are allergic to flea bites or not, the best solution to the problem is control of the insect. The war on fleas should have three simultaneous attack points: (1) the infested pet; (2) the interior of the home; and (3) the yard.
