

Lady Pilots Prepare for Van Nuys-to-Georgia Race

Taking to the air tomorrow for the 22nd annual Powder Puff Derby will be pilot Margaret Callaway of San Pedro and co-pilot Margaret Ross of Torrance. They'll be competing with women flying teams from throughout the United States and some foreign countries in the Van Nuys-to-Savannah, Ga. race.

The "air-conditioned" team of Margaret and Margaret will make the three-day journey in a Bellanca 260. Flight sponsors are Hunt Spiller Manufacturing of San Francisco and Rose Bellanca Sales of Long Beach.

A veteran of the air, Mrs. Callaway has been flying for 22 years and placed fifth in the 1967 Powder Puff Derby. She has placed in to top ten in 12 previous Powder Puff Derbies and won the Interna-

tional Air Race from Canada to Cuba.

MRS. CALLAWAY and her husband, Lt. Col. Richard D. Callaway (USAF-ret.), have two daughters, Sandra and Margo, both confirmed aviatrices.

Currently a flight instructor at Peninsula Aviation in Torrance, Mrs. Callaway holds a commercial license and instrument, flight instructor, and instrument flight instructor ratings with more than 9,000 hours.

Co-pilot Margaret Ross, a dental technician, has one previous Powder Puff Derby to her credit. She served on the PPD board of directors for five years in an organizational capacity in charge of inspecting race aircraft and has also worked on the handi-

capping committee, setting par speeds.

MRS. ROSS' husband Robert, a field service engineer for General Electric, recently returned from an eight-month assignment with a helicopter squadron in Vietnam. Their son John is five years old.

The Callaway-Ross team practiced up for the Derby with a recent junket through Central America. The 9,000-mile International Air Race took them from Managua, Nicaragua, to Panama City, Fla. On the way south, they visited all the major cities of Mexico.

Both flying buffs are members of the Ninety-Nines Inc., an organization of licensed women pilots. Mrs. Ross is currently chairman of the Long Beach chapter.

Yorktown Crew Keeps Cake Specialist Busy

For more than two and a half years Commissaryman 3/C James Cadwell, husband of Kathleen Cadwell of Torrance, has been combining imagination and patience in decorating ceremonial cakes that mark the numerous cake-cutting events held aboard the USS Yorktown.

Just the other day Cadwell decorated a cake honoring Lt. (j.g.) Barry Fry's 124,000th landing aboard this anti-submarine warfare aircraft carrier. This is just one of about 80 different cakes Cadwell has decorated in the five months the Yorktown has been deployed on its current Western Pacific cruise.

Having no formalized training before he joined the Navy, Cadwell took advantage of his mess-cooking period aboard ship by observing how cakes were molded, carved, and given final trimmings.

IN FEBRUARY, 1966, Cadwell began decorating cakes as well as baking pies, rolls, cookies, and cakes for the crewmembers aboard the famed "Fighting Lady."

Asked how long it usually takes to decorate a cake for a special occasion, Cadwell said, "Actually, it depends on

the order. Usually, a cake takes about two to two and a half hours to decorate. On the other hand, a cake on which detailed garnishing is requested takes about five to eight hours of molding and carving."

Recalling one of the biggest cake-cutting ceremonies aboard Yorktown, Cadwell took special pride in decorating 24 separate cakes for the last change of command. Sixty pounds of icing were used in adorning the cakes. Detailed trimmings were what took much of the 14 hours, not devoted to baking or frosting the cakes.

NORMALLY, a 24-to-48-hour notice is required for cake-cuttings; however, if an unforeseen prominent occurrence takes place, Cadwell can decorate a cake in less than half an hour, provided the cake is prepared for decorating.

With all the noteworthy occasions happening aboard this command post of a hunter-killer group, the cake-cuttings add that extra topping to the accomplishments of the Yorktown, especially when in the Sea of Japan and now in the Tonkin Gulf. The "Fighting Lady's" cake specialist has contributed greatly to her deeds with his imaginative creations.

New Flag Will Fly In County

The Board of Supervisors has directed that the new official flag of the county of Los Angeles fly over all county buildings and regional parks.

Chief Administrative Officer Linton S. Hollinger was directed to make the necessary arrangements. The official county flag, designed by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, was adopted recently by the Board of Supervisors. It in-

cludes the colors blue, green, and gold.

Hahn said the blue field signifies clear skies, the green is to "keep Los Angeles beautiful," and the gold stands for the land of opportunity.

In the center of the blue field is the official Los Angeles County seal, also designed by Supervisor Hahn several years ago.

Currently the flag flies over the Hall of Administration

and Court House in downtown Los Angeles and at the Los Angeles Memorial Sports Arena.
