## Around the World with Stan Delaplane

At a rainy 9:10 in the London morning, we caught the train that makes a five-hour run to this highland lake country (Bowness-on-Windermere) 40 miles below the Scottish border. (First-class compartments. Breakfast and lunch aboard.)

Americans, who storm London, the Shakespeare country and the Cathedral cities, don't know this lovely green country. The British do. So hotel rates are reasonable—there are wonderful old farmhouses that advertise "bed and breakfast" for about \$3.

There are eight major lakes and dozens of smaller waters. High peaks. Roman border forts. The country is wild and open. And you can get a shaggy little "fell pony" for \$1.80 an hour with a packed lunch. A comfortable hotel with three meals and afternoon tea (plus a pony of your own) goes for \$40 a week. A Windermere class sailing boat (27 feet) rents for \$2.40 an hour. And a bargain for the young-at-heart: \$50 a week for hotel, three meals and a week's lessons in your choice of sailing, water skiing or pony riding.

Not easy, but not impossible. London is jammed more than ever this summer. I got into a dreary place recommended by British Travel, the Government's tourist bureau. But with a

little phoning, found a pleasant, very nice place—Bryanston Court Hotel, 58 Great Cumberland Place, (\$12 double with breakfast.) In two blocks along this street, I saw four other small hotels that looked much the same.

This is just down from Marble Arch. You could take a taxi and shop the street. Pass over the enormous Cumberland Hotel at the top of the street. Many rooms. Much in-and-out traffic. And a factory. Skip it.

"Would you advise travel on British trains for getting around?"

I've only been on two. The Golden Arrow coming up to London from the boat train at Dover is splendid. Tea or drinks served at your seat. A beautiful ride through southern England. The ride up here was good. Seats could stand cleaning. British railroad stations are as dreary as any in the world.

Rates are good. And if you go to a U.S. or Canadian travel agent, you can get a special tariff that gives you a lot more mileage for the dollar.

"We've heard about stopping at pubs, but does this mean staying at a bar?"

The pub is a "public house." They are all "hotels," but some run with the idea of renting rooms as well as selling food and drink. These are the country pubs. And with early afternoon searching, you can luck into wonderful little places with 10 or 12 rooms.

Pubs are good places to stop for lunch. They usually serve sandwiches, hard to come by in restaurants where they want to sell the five-course lunch. There's a disadvantage if you have children. No children under 16 can go in bars. So, if you want a drink and lunch with children, you look for a place saying "Fully Licensed."

There are several sides to the pub. Different rooms served from the same bar which is centered so that it faces on all rooms. The "public bar" is for the darts game and men. The "saloon bar" has seats and tables. OK for women alone if they like. You can get sandwiches served in here. Sometimes you run into the "parlor bar." Just what it says—a little parlor where drinks and sandwiches are brought to you.

The country pubs display a swinging sign, colorfully painted: "The King's Arms," "The Rose and Crown," "The Green Man." I had lunch up here yesterday at a pub called "The Drunken Duck." There's no finer more cheerful place for beer and lunch than the country pub. And you must try it.
