

Marines To Hold Reunion



'Learn to Sail' Classes Offered

Sailing instruction for beginning and advanced students is now being offered by the Redondo Beach Department of Recreation and Parks, Lido 14s, popular daysailors, are used for the lessons given at King Harbor. The boats are sloop rigged with center boards and the used for fun and racing.

A swimming test and a \$15 fee for a total of 12 hours of instruction also are required. The swimming test is based on the applicant's ability to stay afloat for 5 minutes while fully clothed. In lieu of the swimming test, an American Red Cross Senior Life Saving card, issued within the last three years, is acceptable.

A text will be furnished at the initial lesson along with weekly course outlines. The lessons are available in two schedule plans. The classes meet two hours per day, Monday, Wednesday and Friday for six weeks at the following times: 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., 1 to 3 p.m., 3 to 5 p.m., or 6 to 8 p.m. Saturday classes meet one day per week for six weeks during the same time periods.


Camera Club Sets Photo Day
