

# Ban on Secret Meetings Extended to Committees

SACRAMENTO. — The assembly has concurred in senate amendments and sent to Gov. Ronald Reagan AB 202, by Assemblyman James A. Hayes (R-Long Beach) which prohibits secret meetings of advisory commissions and committees appointed by cities, counties, and other public agencies.

The assembly concurred in the senate amendments by a 45-11 vote.

Opposing the measure was Assemblyman Peter F. Schabarum (R-Covina), who said that "meaningful citizens committees" could not work effectively and the law would reduce participation by citizens in these committees.

HAYES indicated that he would favor the law be extended to include the actions of the legislature but a bill proposing such a change "could not be passed" through the legislature now.

In explaining the bill, Hayes stated, "AB 202 requires city, county and other public agencies, which have advisory commissions or committees, to hold all their meetings in public. The bill prescribes the type of notice to be given and is carefully designed to meet the subterfuges that have been carried on by some public agencies in creating 'temporary advisory commissions' in order to avoid the clear provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act."

THE BROWN ACT requires that the public's business be conducted in meetings open to the public.

Hayes said "to use these advisory agencies to avoid that clear requirement of the law is something that will not be tolerated. These advisory bodies have been widely used in Los Angeles County and in Stanislaus and San Luis Obispo counties. AB 202 prohibits this evasion of the Brown Act in the future."

The bill was vigorously opposed by the League of California Cities, but the league withdrew its opposition prior to the vote by the lower house.
