HONOLULU — Auwe, brudda! There's pilikia in Paradise. In the last eight years they've built 120 high-rise buildings on this lovely island. Twenty-eight more are going up now, mostly at Waikiki.

The hammer of pile-drivers, the roar of caterpillars and cement trucks is so fierce, the Mayor called a committee on noise. (But they don't know what to do about it either.)

The concrete high-rise cuts off the trade wind. It traps the heat on Kalakua Avenue. And at night, teenagers cruise the street, bumper-to-bumper, filling the canyon with gasoline fumes. (There are 700,000 islanders, and 600,000 live on this one.)

Which is to say, I'd give Waikiki a light once-over in Hawaii plans. Head for the breezy, blue sky Outer Island. And yes, there's a little smog along the beach avenue in the morning. Auwe!

"We have a few months to visit Hawaii, but I would prefer to do some work. Is that possible? And can you tell us about living costs?"

The "Help Wanted" ads in Honolulu papers are thicker than any city in America. Biggest shortage is hotel help. Next big shortage will be airline help—more airlines will be allowed to fly in here.

Food and housing costs about 15 per cent more than mainland cities. You get a break on clothing—shorts, shirts, and sandals year round. Houses don't need heating.

Pay is not so good. Hawaii ranks No. 14 among the States in per capita income. But the climate is superb, and you're always within reach of a beach. If you are going to be on short money, you might as well be short in pleasant surroundings.

I've run into two useful books on the islands. "All About Hawaii" is the updated old "Thrum's Hawaii Annual." Paperback, 350 pages of good background history and descriptions of each island. Statistics on income, spending, cost of living. Good for anyone planning to live here. Costs \$1.50 by mail from Star-Bulletin Printing Co., 420 Ward St., Honolulu.

"Hawaii on \$5 and \$10 a Day" is for vacationers on a budget. (And who isn't?) Very good for inexpensive places to stay and eat on all the islands. Plus some good sightseeing tips. Most book stores should have it. \$1.95. If not, it's distributed by Simon and Schuster, 630 Fifth Ave., New York City.

There are some little freighters from Suva in Fiji running to island ports you never heard of. They take out supplies and pick up copra. There are copra schooners running from Paete in Tahiti to the atolls, too.

Fiji Airways flies from Suva to far away islands in the Ellice group and the Gilberts. RAI flies from Paete to some of the atolls and to Raiatea and Bora Bora. There's a new airline — Air Micronesia — flying from Honolulu to the Trust Territories.

Accommodations are sketchy, except for Bora Bora with a first-class hotel and Raiatea where there's a hotel and a Club Mediterranean place. But you can get to the far out coconut islands and see native life that probably won't be around ten years from now.

True. But island people seem to know where and when not to fish. Even so, we bought a lobster in Suva. An hour after eating it, my wife got a high skin temperature and turned as bright red as a sunburn. She didn't feel sick, but it lasted a couple of hours. (Local doctors tell you to take Epsom Salts. Natives drink coconut milk for it.)

Von's Markets Launch Educational Project

One of the most unusual educational projects ever attempted by a food chain has been announced by Von's Grocery Co. The project involves an effort to interest school children in the duties and cares of the President of the United States and in the workings of the government.

All Von's Grocery Co. stores are now offering small plastic figurines of each of the nation's 35 Presidents, hand painted to show exactly how each looked and dressed.

In order to permit mounting them as a set, the company also includes a molded reviewing stand to which the figures may be glued. An eight-page album, giving a brief biographical sketch of each President, is offered free with each reviewing stand.

AS A FURTHER incentive, Von's Grocery Co. has sent letters to all public and parochial schools throughout the area announcing an essay contest based on the title "The President as a Leader." The contest is open to school children in the 5th to 8th grades, and the essay may be written about any of the 35 U.S. Presidents.
