"Is your child on drugs?" This question, worrying parents on a national scale and what may be done to combat the problem, will be discussed by Dr. Paul H. Lorhan, of Palos Verdes, during a general meeting of Harbor General Hospital Auxiliary, Oct. 1, at 1 p.m.

"This meeting will be held in the auditorium of the hospital at 1000 West Carson St., Torrance, and will be open to all volunteers, friends, hospital personnel, and the general public," Mrs. Grace Lorhan, Auxiliary president and the doctor's wife, announced.

Dr. Lorhan is a professor of anesthesiology at UCLA and chief of that department at Harbor General Hospital.

The doctor's discussion will cover the age groups mostly involved as victims of "pushers", why the latter are not disclosed by the youngsters, and what parents can do about closer communication with their children when there are indications that drugs are being supplied to them.
